| Description: Learn how local wildlife survives the winter through hands-on activities using our pelts and resident live animals. Includes an optional half-hour nature walk. Note: the live animals are only part of the program when at the Kerry Wood Nature Centre; we do not travel with the live animals to your school. | |
